<b>SCORCHING</b>	Prepare a persuasive speech arguing for or against God and His responsibility for evil	Create a mathematic puzzle or game that reflects common numbers and themes found within the topic of Good & Evil. E.g The Inconsistent Triad	Create a piece of art or a sculpture that reflects an example of suffering or an example of when suffering has been ended by acts of love	Write an essay showing different arguments around the statement:  "If God existed he wouldn't allow us to suffer."
<b>HOT</b>	Prepare a presentation/lecture about: The problem of Evil	Research how much money the UK gives to charity compared to other countries and present the data in a graph	Create a piece of artwork, painting or poster that symbolises an aspect or interpretation of evil and suffering	Write at least a page explaining the problem of evil and how we can explain why God allows suffering in the world.
<b>WARM</b>	Create a quiz with at least 10 questions on the topic of Evil and Suffering and then ask 2 people to complete the quiz	Go through a few magazines or newspapers. Calculate how many stories there are about good events compared to bad events happening.	Produce a piece of artwork about the story of The Fall of Adam and Eve.	Write a story that holds a message/moral of why we suffer on Earth OR a newspaper article about Suffering and Evil in the world.
