English

Year 7

- Complete what was supposed to be on the Y7 exam - Write a diary entry from the point of view of Carlos describing your emotions after the death of Jerome.
- Research racism / fascism in the US and the UK and create a poster / ppt/ fact file / information booklet to display your findings.
- Write a letter to the government to ask them to tackle racism / poverty and suggest what they could do.
- Write your own story about racism. It does not have to be about someone dying, and it does not have to be set in the US. It can be about racism in any form.
- Read any books you have and write a short review of them
- Read your AR books
- Read online articles – particularly ones in a newspaper 'Comment' or 'Opinion' section.
- Complete a diary entry in the book provided by your teacher

- Write a daily diary entry of your time at home. Use it like a best friend to share your thoughts and fears.
- Read your AR book every day. When finished write a book review to hang up in the library.
- Describe your outside area; it could be your garden or your view from the window. Use your senses... what can you see, hear, smell, taste and feel. Can you underline all the adjectives you have used?
- Write a story about someone who lives on the moon. What do they eat? What do their houses look like? What language do they speak? What does it sound like?
- Describe a world underground where ants live. Try to use a simile, metaphor and alliteration. You must use your senses.
- Draw a character from your imagination. Label it describing the way it moves, smells, talks and eats. Write four paragraphs about one day in your characters life.
- Read your AR books/complete booklet

Maths:

1. Learn all times tables fluently and confidently up to 12 x 12
2. Work through the small workbook given to you by your teacher
3. Log on to mymaths if you are able to and complete the 'Mixed times table worksheet'. Repeat it until you have scored 100%!
4. Log on to mymaths and work through the four mixed assessments that have been set. Use mymaths to do the lessons before you answer the questions if you are struggling
5. Produce a poster/booklet showing everything you know about ratio. Research examples of when it is used in real life, think about the different types of ratio questions there are and what other topics it is linked to.

Science:

1. Create a poster on "How to keep safe in the laboratory". Include hazard symbols and laboratory rules.
2. Design a poster on healthy eating; make sure to include different food groups and why they are important for our diet.
3. Compare the structure of animal and plant cells; try to include how we can see animal and plant cells.
4. Create a short quiz based on animal and plant cells. Begin with easy questions and then try and make those questions towards the end harder. You can use the link to help you with ideas:

5. Create a poster on the properties of solids, liquids and gases; include particle diagrams to make your poster look great.
6. Create a mind-map which identifies and describes the different forces that act on objects. You may also include how we measure forces.

Religious Education:

1. Research and read in the bible or online the story of Pentecost. What happened and who was present? Imagine you were there as a person in the crowd hearing the disciples. Write a newspaper article from your point of view.
2. Research both St Peter and St Paul: who where they, what did they do in the church, what there they like as people? Why are they important, what did they write? Make a poster showing their similarities and differences
3. Research the Reformation in Europe and the person Martin Luther create a poster based on his arguments against the church called his 95 Theses.
4. Learn all the keywords and key concepts from your knowledge organiser on Church History, you must be able to recall these from memory. Ensure you test yourself twice each week
5. Create a poster about Mary the mother of Jesus – explain why his is an important figure and how she is seen as a role model in the church
6. Research project on Saint John Henry Newman. Just must write an essay (one page) about who he was and why he was important and was made a saint. You must also create a piece of artwork of St John Henry Newman

1. create a family tree of your family – how far back can you go?
2. Build a medieval castle
3. Prepare a newspaper article on the

5. create a family crest
6. Using the letters of the alphabet write a key Historical word for each letter

Geography:


