Create a poster which states what a non-communicable disease is and also explains the main differences between a communicable disease and a non-communicable disease. 2. Research what the following words mean: risk factors, correlations and causal mechanisms. Then write an extended answer which explains the difference between risk factors, correlations and causal mechanisms. You may give examples to strength your answer. Summarise the differences between exothermic and endothermic reactions in terms of energy transfer. You can organise your ideas into a table. In your answer, you must include the reaction profile for both an exothermic and endothermic reaction. 4. Describe the chemical reaction which takes place in a disposable hand warmer. Then describe how a reusable hand warmer works. You may include labelled diagrams to help you answer this question. Create a fact file about the three types of radiation; alpha, beta and gamma. You must include a diagram which identifies key properties such as the differing

Science (continued)	<p>ranges and penetrating powers of these types of radiation in addition to their uses. Also include sources of natural and man-made radiation. In your answer, explain the effect this may have on human cells for example.</p>
Religious Education	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Produce a creative piece of work that focuses on one aspect of the Easter story. It could be a piece of art, a poem, story, picture, newspaper article, video, recorded spoken report, song, sculpture, poster. It doesn't matter what it is as long as it is creative and you have given it lots of effort! There will be prizes for the best one in each year group when we return to school! 2. www.senecalearning.com You should have already worked through all 3 topics from year 10: Judaism, Sin & Forgiveness and Life After Death. If not then you are behind. If you have move on to look at Origins and Meanings which we will start in Year 11. 3. Create a revision poster about the virgin Mary. In your poster you must include the following information; Explain who the Virgin Mary is and why she is important to Jesus Why is Mary regarded as being born with immaculate conception How was Mary dedicated to God during her life? How does Mary represent faith? Why could someone argue that the virgin Mary was the first disciple of Jesus? How is Mary remembered by Catholics today? Challenge (optional)- If Mary could be argued as being the first disciple of Jesus, does this mean that women should be allowed to become priests? Research the Catholic opinion of women becoming priests, what types of Christians do allow for women to become priests, and reasons for and against each argument. 4. Create 5 Fifa cards/ Top Trump cards for important religious figures in Judaism and/or Christianity. What would their statistics be? How would they compare to each other? Give an explanation for each statistic you have chosen. What colour would your cards be and why? Challenge – Can you think of a statistic which no –one else would think of and include this on your card? An additional revision exercise could be for pupils to create a crossword from 20 key words they have studied so far. This task could be applied to all year groups. 5. Watch the Strictly Kosher series on YouTube. Research 3 specific celebrations/rituals/way of life presented in the series and create revision resources about them i.e. booklet/cards.
