

1. What will my transition to secondary school look like this year?

Although this year may look a little different you will still be able to become familiar with the school and the teachers before you start. A teacher will also be calling you in the summer term to find out a bit more about you and to answer any questions you may have.

2. Where do I go when I start school?

On your first day, you will be immediately met by the friendly faces of the teachers and directed to the hall. From there, you will be put into your form groups and will spend time getting to know your form tutor and other students in your form group.

3. What is a form tutor?

A form tutor is a member of staff whose job it is to take care of their tutor group. You will see your form tutor every day for twenty minutes so they will get to know you very well. They are there to support you in your school life and they will check you have everything you need every day so you can be the best you can be.

4. What time should I arrive on my first day?

School starts every day at 8:40am and finishes at 3pm but we would recommend trying to arrive by 8:30am so you have plenty of time to settle ahead of the school day.

5. What happens if I get lost?

This is the question that is asked the most and it is a natural worry to have. On your first day, you will be given a tour of the school so you can begin to familiarise yourself with the school buildings. Try not to worry about getting lost or finding your way round the school site, there will be plenty of older students and staff who will help you find your way and at Holy Trinity everyone wants to help and make you feel safe.

6. What do I wear on the first day and what do I need to bring?

In light of current Covid19 schools guidance, we are currently reviewing all protocols related to what exact uniform pupils will wear in September and what equipment they will be expected to bring into school. Parents will be informed about this in due course.
